#### **Mobile clinics established**

Mobile clinics are now open in South Mississippi and Louisiana to provide medical treatment to veterans displaced by Hurricane Katrina.

The mobile clinics, located in Hattiesburg, McComb, and Hammond are open from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, from 8 a.m. to Noon on Saturday, and 1p.m. to 5 p.m. on Sunday.

The addresses for the clinics are:

• Hattiesburg: 5001 Hardy Street

• McComb: Corner of Aston Street and West Avenue

• Hammond: 15790 Paul Vegas Drive
